

## **Privacy statement**

### **Data officers and data protection adviser**

In the Danish National Waste Register (Waste Register), we treat the following categories of personal data: general personal data including name, employment position and work phone. In addition, payment information can be stored in the system. The Danish Energy Agency is responsible for processing the personal data we have received.

### **Why we process your personal data**

We process your personal data to perform the necessary case processing for your registration in the Waste Register.

The legal basis for our processing of personal data follows from Article 6 (1) of the Data Protection Regulation, 1, e. If you sent us sensitive information, these are treated in accordance to Article 9 (1) of the Data Protection Regulation, paragraph 2, f. If you have sent us information on criminal matters, our treatment follows § 8 of the Data Protection Act, point 1 and 2, 3.

### **We may pass on your personal data to the following recipients**

The Danish Energy Agency passes on your personal data to others, if it is necessary for the processing of your inquiry. It can e.g. be other public authorities, which utilize the information.

The Danish Energy Agency also in some cases passes on your personal data for data processors, which support the Danish Energy Agency's journalization and case processing systems. The Danish Energy Agency may also disclose your personal data in connection with other tasks carried out by the Danish Energy Agency. For example, if the Danish Energy Agency receives a request for access to your case where your personal data is included, we usually disclose the information unless the information is confidential or if there are special circumstances.

### **How is my personal data handled?**

For Danish companies, certain information is deducted from the CVR register. We cannot currently say how long the personal data will be stored. However, we can inform you that information about you found in the Energy Agency electronic case and document management system, will be

transferred for storage in the National Archives according to the rules of archive legislation, after completion of the journal period when the case has been completed.

**The right to withdraw consent**

If you have submitted personal information about you, you have the right to withdraw your consent at any time. You can do this by contacting us. If you choose to withdraw your consent, it does not affect the legality of our processing of your personal data, based on your previously announced consent up to the time of the withdrawal. The withdrawal of your consent will therefore only gain effect from the time of withdrawal.

**General rights in relation to our treatment of information about you.**

After the Data Protection Regulation, you have a number of rights in relation to our treatment of information about you. If you want to make use of your rights, contact the Danish Energy Agency.
